From the Pastor's Desk

Greetings all!

As I sit here today, preparing in my mind what I want to say, I am distinctly reminded of the fragile nature of our human existence. We are rapidly approaching Lent, a time in which we observe the preparation for Easter through prayer, doing penance, mortifying the flesh, repentance of sins, giving to those in need, and denial of ourselves. We start this time with Ash Wednesday.

Ash Wednesday derives its name from the placing of repentance ashes on the foreheads of participants to either the words "Repent and believe in the Gospel" or the dictum "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return." Ash Wednesday is therefore a remembrance of sorts. It is a time to reflect on how the year has started but also to take a deep look at where our hearts truly lie. But it also is a way to remember what the people of the time before Christ would do when they prepared themselves to repent of their sins. The tradition was to put on sackcloth and throw dust upon yourself as a way to show that you were mourning for the sins you have done. While we don't necessarily put on a sackcloth or throw dust all over our bodies, we do remember this remorseful act by putting the sign of the cross (in remembrance of what Christ did for us) upon our foreheads or hands.

As we move into this time of reflection this year, I want to encourage all of us to look back over the last few months, years, or in some cases, decades and look at the ways that we have done things for which we might need grace and forgiveness from God and from others. I want to encourage us to take a deep dive into our hearts and look at the ways that we might have also been hurt by others. It is only through looking at those places and acknowledging the hurt or pain we might have felt or caused that we can begin to move toward forgiveness. This year, I am going to attempt to also take us on a journey through our Facebook group (https://www.facebook.com/groups/269721049717923/). Each week, I will post a devotional and a question for thought. As we move through this time, feel free to comment with your thoughts or just read the post so that we can stay connected on this Lenten journey.

Church News

Church Cancellations:

In the case of bad weather (snow, rain, power outage, etc.) please make sure to check your email and WFMZ for any cancellations that may occur. We have occasionally had to cancel church due to bad weather and other circumstances. The decision to cancel due to bad weather are based on the President of Council and Pastor's attempt to protect everyone's safety using information regarding road conditions. This decision is made at approximately 6:30 AM, so that it appears on the WFMZ weather alerts, by 7 AM. You may also call the church office, where messages would be left on the voicemail, if there are any cancellations.

NEW - Quarterly Town Hall Meetings:

As a result of an open discussion at the Annual Meeting on February 16, a new quarterly meeting will be established. This meeting will gather after worship and will entail fellowship and conversation quarterly. The goals of these meetings are to provide transparency in communication and also provide the opportunity to discuss the many ways the church is changing lives as a community of faith. In addition, the Council will present any happenings and updates that the congregation needs to be aware of. The quarterly Town Hall meetings will be Potluck style and held in the Fellowship Hall at the round tables. The first meeting is scheduled for March 22 and future dates will be announced for June, September and December.

BREEZE (Church Directory) Training and Introduction - To Be Offered March 22:

In October, Church Council began a process of converting our database of members from a desktop application, (which could previously only be accessed by one person), to an online database which will be accessible by all individuals accepted as members.

At that meeting, we had a conversation about Breeze and a very brief introduction to the database was offered. Council would like to roll out the database to all the members of the church at the end of March and will offer a more thorough introduction and training about the database during the first Quarterly Town Hall meeting, on March 22.

In order to have access to the database, you must, if you have not already (prior to March 22), provide an email address to Pastor Christian. This database will only be accessible to those who are invited to join. Please hold all your questions regarding the database until we have the training session on March 22, so that all questions and answers can be heard at the same time.

<u>Cemetery Plot Price Increasing:</u> On March 15, the price for cemetery plots will be increasing to meet the costs associated with maintaining the cemetery. The plot price for members will go to \$450, and for non-members, the price will be \$550. Please see Terry Miller if you are in need of a cemetery plot or for more information.

If you would like to give your offering electronically, we now have a method for you to do just that. Below are the instructions to set up you electronic offering account. Follow the instructions on the website. If you need added help: Pastor Christian can help you. For those who wish to continue using the regular offering envelopes, you will continue to receive the envelopes in the mail as you have in the past. The envelopes will continue to be mailed to you every 2 months. If you have any questions about the envelopes, please contact Pastor Christian. If you are using E Offering and no longer wish to receive envelopes, please let Pastor Christian know this as well.

Instructions on How to Sign Up for Electronic Offering

To create a new account, go to: www.members.myEoffering.com

On Log in screen, click "register"

Enter the following information: Name, E-mail, and choose a password that you will remember. Once you have this completed, click on "Register", you will receive an email on how to finish registering. Once you have clicked on the link from email, you will need to login and then read the onscreen instructions and click the "Proceed" button.

Next, you will need to select a church, so click on "Churches" at the top of the screen. Next click on "Join a church+". Search for Chestnut Hill Church, select the church which has our address showing, and "Join+". You do not need to provide a member or envelope #.

After you have selected Chestnut Hill Church, you must add a wallet. Click on "Wallets" on the top of the screen and then "Add a Wallet+". Follow the onscreen instructions as they come up on the screen...and click on "Add Wallet+"

To setup an offering, click on "Offerings" at the top of the page and "Add New Offering+". Choose the option that best fits how often you would like to give and the date upon which to begin drawing those funds. Funding source is your choice from where to draw the funds (i.e. your checking account or credit card found in your "Wallets"). Remember to select the fund to which you would like your offering to go, enter an amount and if you choose to contribute to more than one fund, you have the option to do so.

Fees to use a checking or savings account are \$.30 and the fees for using a credit card fees determined by the credit card company.


